I was inspired by Grandfather Harry and Grandmother Molly Parker Hirshberg Green. They were collectors of antiques and cameras. I remember visiting each of them in St. Petersburg, FL and at the This 'n That Antique Shop when I was a child through my adult years. I recently visited Grandpa Harry and Grandma Molly and my father Sherwin Hirshberg in St. Petersburg in or around 1996. I spoke with him several times since. I enjoyed identifying that when he yelled at me when I was around 10 years old, when I was having difficulty lifting myself out of the fishing boat onto the dock up to walk up to the house, that he was not being mean to me for no reason, or because I was slow, but rather he just wanted to clean up and begin cooking the trout or catfish for all of us for dinner. I walked from Coquina Key on November 21, 2012 to attend the funeral but missed it because of the Army's Intelligence Agency's negligence in honoring those that served by ensuring that family can attend the funeral. Many family could not attend but I am sure they send their best wishes and pray that he rests in peace. I regret that I could not speak with Harry this last week. I was trying to identify the assisted living facility he was living in but experienced much stonewalling by the Army for no valid reason. I don't know of any reason why Harry would not wish that I attend his funeral. Harry, if can, please convey a message if there was a reason that you did not want me at your funeral. Otherwise, please encourage the Army to accept my lawsuit. I walked over six miles, without food, water, holes on the bottom of my shoes. I am not a drug user, but the local agencies are mistreating me and forcing me to walk.
