Loretta Nelson of St Petersburg, Florida passed away Monday, February 4, 2019 in Northside Hospital, St Petersburg after some recent health challenges. She was 78.

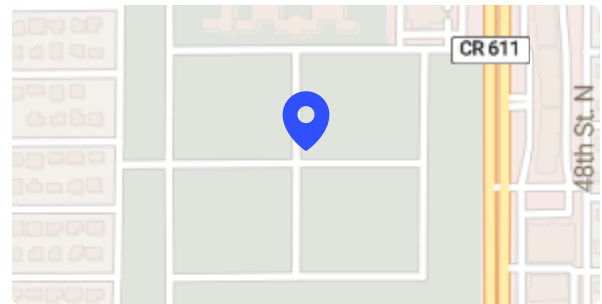

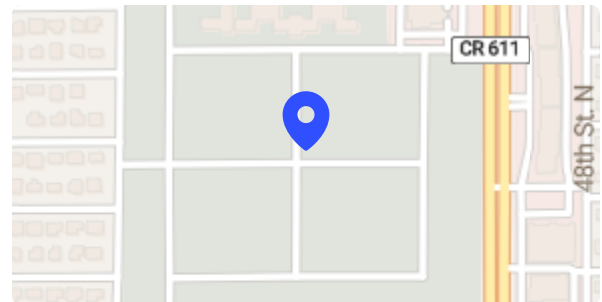

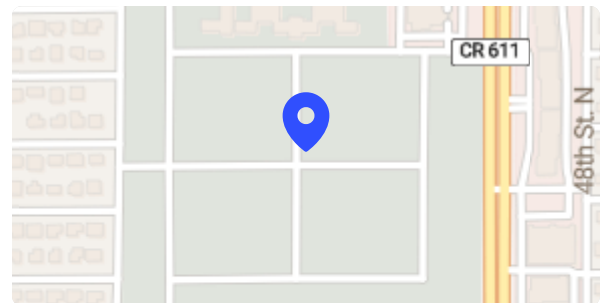
