**E**loise "Ellie" Jones Woodard died January 28, 2020 at Mid Pinellas Hospice in St. Petersburg at the age of 87 due to a very short battle with an aggressive form of cancer. She was born October 27, 1932 in Minden, Louisiana to parents Ruben and Ora Lee Jones.

Ellie or Miss Ellie as she was called by many, was born and raised in this small town so she had this southern charm that was apparent by everyone she met. She was always complimented on her accent, looks and smile. She was a beautiful lady.
