Victor N. Della Rocco, 88, passed away on Tuesday, May 26, 2020. Victor was born November 16, 1931 in Richmondville, New York to the late Victor and Leta Mae (Mackey) Della Rocco. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by two brothers, Paul Della Rocco and Roger Della Rocco. Vic was also predeceased by his niece Kimberly Della Rocco Kennedy and long-time friend and companion Virginia Relyea.

Victor grew up in Schenectady, New York and graduated from Draper High School. After graduation, Victor enlisted in the United States Air Force. He served in the Korean War. 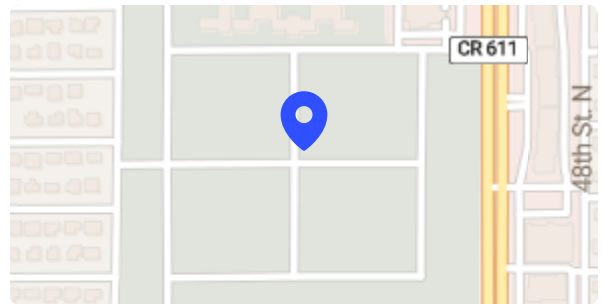

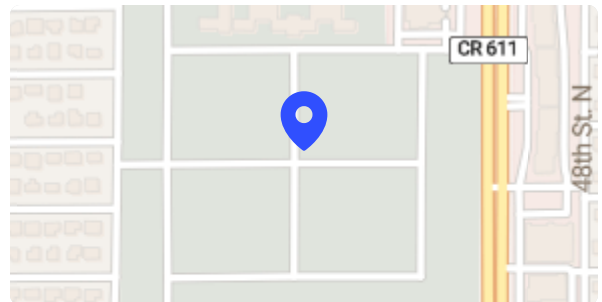

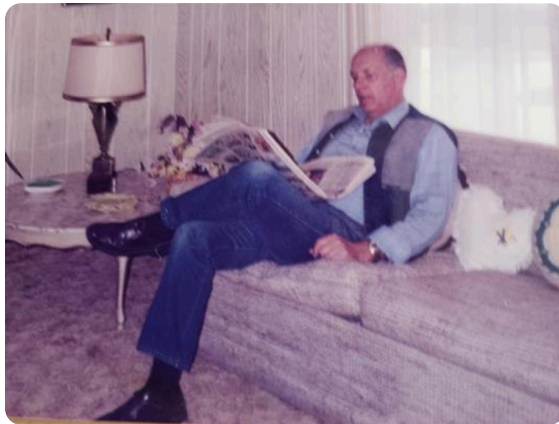
