She migrated to Baltimore, Maryland, USA in 1968 then to Brooklyn, New York in 1969 and finally retired in 1985 and settled in St. Petersburg, Florida, where she will be laid to rest.

She was a legal secretary for most of her life retiring in 1985.

She was predeceased by her husband, Clifton Millet and her sisters, Elsa Monsano, Sylphide Graves, and her brothers, Cuthbert Waithe and James Waithe.

Memorial Park Funeral Home and Cemetery, St. Petersburg is in charge of the arrangements.



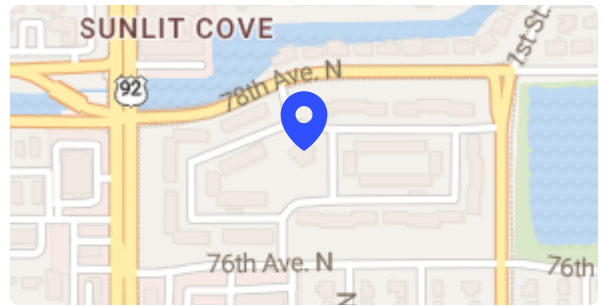

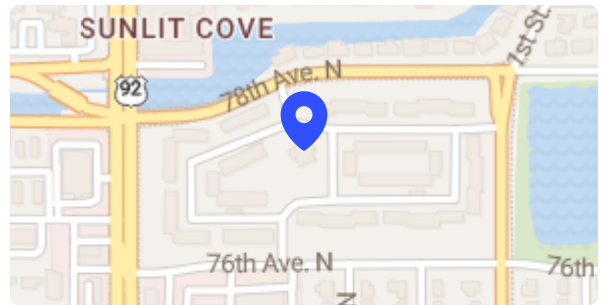

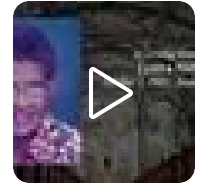
