George “Windy” Wesley Hayes Sr., 96, of Largo, Florida, passed away peacefully at home on October 9, 2025, surrounded by the love of his family.

Born March 1, 1929, in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania, he met the love of his life there, and they later moved to Kearny, New Jersey, to begin their life and raise a family. George worked his entire career as a foreman at American Oil & Supply in Newark, New Jersey, retiring in 1992. He later relocated to Largo, Florida where he devoted his time to volunteering and giving back to his community. In his retirement he was a beloved employee of Publix.

An avid Bingo player and devoted fan of the Tampa Bay Rays, George was also a gifted storyteller known for his quick wit, generous and gentle spirit, and his kindness.
